Religious Liberty Prayer Bulletin

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM UNDER THREAT IN THE WEST

The principal religious liberty trend of the multicultural West is that religious liberty is disappearing as the culture's biblical foundations are eroded. Unfortunately, most churches and Christians are not going to realise it until the new social order has been consolidated and persecution starts to strike them directly. Christians in the West are losing the right to criticise Islam and witness to Muslims. They are also losing the right to conscientiously object to new social norms being imposed on them essentially at the behest of Gay Lesbian Bisexual Transgender (GLBT) lobby groups. Just as in non-free states, Western law-makers and lawenforcers are justifying their interventions as necessary to maintain 'peace' and/or defend 'equality' against 'extremist fundamentalism' (i.e. any ideas contrary to the democratic consensus). Rattled by the chaos and confusion of cultural collapse -- the result of a culture losing its foundations --Western governments are increasingly resorting to external restraint and authoritarian repression. They are opting for 'peace' through appeasement, rather than justice and defence of their Constitutions through education and rule of law. To remove contradictions, laws are being amended and re-interpreted and fundamental concepts are being redefined. Driven by fear of unrest, Western governments are increasingly proving themselves willing to secure 'peace' at any price -- even the loss of liberty. As soon as it appears that intolerant forces might protest, riot or divert their collective vote elsewhere, weak Western democracies yield and appease, repressing 'divisive' or 'provocative' elements at the behest of the most belligerent. And in a 'post-Christian' (as distinct from Judeo-Christian) culture, there is nothing as divisive and provocative as the gospel message and righteousness of Christianity.

The religious liberty threat article was researched and written by Elizabeth Kendal, who was a keynote speaker at the ACC Conference 2009 and spoke at the February 2010 Ashburton Seminar. 9. Special Appeal from Rod James Ministry

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Greetings to you in the name of Jesus!

A week ago Shirley and I returned to the Victorian fire recovery areas and spent four days visiting the folk in Strathewen and Kinglake. It was very encouraging to see the amount of redevelopment that had taken place since we were there in February for the anniversary of Black Saturday. A brand new school is under construction in Strathewen and will be finished in time for 4th Term this year. Dirt roads in the valley have been sealed, and about 8 homes were under construction with another couple completed and inhabited. The people were moving on, and seemed much more encouraged with the progress that had been achieved. On the Saturday we went to Kinglake ('on the mountain') to visit a number of households, and were gobsmacked to turn the corner and find one family's temporary home gutted by fire!! Andrew and Rachel Watson, and their three young daughters, had a new home ready to occupy at the time of the Black Saturday fire. It was completely destroyed, and was not insured. Over the following year they established their temporary home with a transportable unit, caravan and covered deck area. The Naracoorte UC gave them funds to put clear vinal zip up awnings on the deck area to let the sun in and keep the winds out.

In the April school holidays the family went away for a few days, and an electrical fault caused all they had to be incinerated. This time they had some insurance, although the company has not been helpful. Andrew is a building industry trademan and works for a company which has been very supportive. The plan is, when insurance is paid and funds allow, to by-pass the temporary dwelling stage and built a permanent house. The company will assist him to do this. We wish to persist in assisting this family, and I have been led to try and raise between \$10,000 and \$20,000 towards their new house.

If you would like to join us in this project you can send a contribution, small or large, to my Rod James Ministry fund (details below). 100% of this money will be forwarded to the Watsons, and will go towards constructing the permanent house.

There is much appreciation in this part of the fire area for all that has been done by us, both prayerfully, financially and through the work parties. My heart is moved to help this young family who have lost so much. I pray that you may be able to help too. Surely the joy of the Lord is our strength, and He is faithful in calling us, in that He will also do it. With love to you all, in the name of Christ, Rod
