# 1. ACC ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND AGM: 15-17 November

The minute record and reports will be sent in 2008 after being finalised and approved by the Council, but a brief report is included below.

Approximately 140 people attended at least one session of the 2007 AGM and conference, with a maximum of 130 at any one time. The meeting consisted of business and plenary sessions. We were well served at the Rydges on Bell Hotel Preston, especially in terms of catering and by the helpful staff.

# **PRAYER**

The whole time was covered by the Prayer Network, led by Revd Anne Hibbard and intercessors from four states. The first annual prayer gathering was also held the day before the conference, hosted by the Macedonian Evangelical Uniting Church in Preston, and local members and conference delegates were able to join in fellowship, teaching and prayer 13-14 November.

### **BUSINESS**

The business mainly revolved around reports and material from the Commissions, as well as reports from the Council and management.

### The work of the six commissions was especially highlighted:

- <u>Cross Cultural</u>: contact is beginning to be made with a wide variety of groups, encouraging them to be more public in their private convictions.
- <u>Discipleship and Evangelism</u>: the bible study and resources development were highlighted. A new study was announced (details in the flyer included with this mail)
- <u>Doctrine and Theology</u>: the draft theological statement prompted considerable discussion and it was agreed to refer the statement for comment from members before final approval by the Council in 2008. A copy of the statement is included with this newsletter.

- <u>Ecumenical</u>: Contact has been made with over 20 heads of churches in Australia and replies received from 7, with meetings to be arranged over the coming months. Contact has also been made with overseas reform groups.
- <u>Networks:</u> reports from each state were presented and the prayer network.
   States were affirmed in their work and the need to support and encourage local members, many of whom feel isolated within the institutional context.
- <u>Social Responsibility</u>: A statement on the church and social responsibility was received and is available on the website. The convenor, Dr Brian Edgar, will be interviewed in the December 2007 ACC Magazine.

Bill Muehlenberg of 'Culturewatch' (<a href="http://www.billmuehlenberg.com/">http://www.billmuehlenberg.com/</a>) spoke on 'Christianity, Secularism And Culture: When Nations Perish', providing an overview of the changes in moral understanding and our environment over the last 30 years.

Philip Johnson spoke on 'New Spirituality in the Church and Marketplace: Churchless Faith, Alternate Pathways and Reinventing the Past', challenging engagement and making a defence for the faith today.

Gordon Preece (Anglican Priest Melbourne, involved with several groups including Urban Seed - <a href="http://www.urbanseed.org/index.php">http://www.urbanseed.org/index.php</a>) spoke on 'Whose Justice? Which Sexuality? Sex, Social Justice and the City of God.', using the TV show, 'Sex and the City' to compare and contrast Augustine's 'City of God', calling us to a renewed cultural commitment and passion for outreach.

Max Champion spoke on the theme 'Gimme some truth' at the Public Rally held at the Macedonian Evangelical Uniting Church in Preston. We are very thankful for the hospitality of the Macedonian Evangelical members, and the generosity of the worshippers, with over \$1700 in offerings.

Overall, the AGM and Conference were an encouraging and stimulating time and we look forward to 2008, and to capitalise on the large and supportive congregational base which is developing in South Australia.
