1. ACC ANNUAL Subscriptions and arrangements

1.1 Individual, couple and family Re-subscriptions

All supporting members who were deemed as needing to re-subscribe would have received a re-subscription notice in early February. This included a covering letter and the subscription renewal invoice notice for supporting membership for 2007 – 2008. Please note that you should return the whole invoice form and note any address corrections or new e-mail on the section which includes your name (s) and address.

The full rate for supporting membership: Individuals, Couples and families - \$50.00, and concession - \$25.00 (self-assessed). You may have changed your subscription basis since joining. If so, please make the appropriate alteration on the invoice. The inaugural meeting in October 2006 decided that the membership year would be the calendar year. That meeting also agreed that anyone providing a donation or membership contribution in the initial period would be regarded as financial for 2007. Donations were the basis until the membership categories and fees were established.

Once the ACC was formally established and incorporated with a constitution in May 2007, it became clear that the membership year should be the financial year. Now that it is 2008, it is necessary to move to the financial year basis for membership. In most cases, members joined or contributed between August 2006 and early 2007, so it is a reasonable time to consider renewing your supporting membership (Note: membership includes ACCatalyst magazine). Some members have already sent their subscription in for this period (2007 – 2008), acting on the understanding it was near time to renew in any case, and these have hopefully been recorded as financial for the year 2007 – 2008, along with the many members who joined during this year. If you have any questions, please contact the office. We have finished entering members' details into the new ACC database. Please assist us to keep our records current by advising of any necessary corrections or changes.

<u>Donations</u>: Many members provided donations to the establishment of the capital fund for the ACC (to provide a long-term financial basis), and we are very grateful for this, as the regular contributions are essential to cover our on-going expenses. I apologize if you have made a donation and not been acknowledged yet. We are still awaiting receipts for the period October – December, and appreciate your patience in awaiting an acknowledgement for your generous support. Over \$25 000 was contributed to the capital fund to enable a longer term financial footing for the ACC.

1.2 Congregational Re-subscriptions

All contact persons for ACC congregations and groups needing advice about the period 2007 – 2008 received their re-subscription notice in January. Please help the ACC by passing this notice onto your Treasurer or Church Council as appropriate, so that the appropriate subscription can be determined and forwarded to the ACC.

1.3 Cluster arrangements: New Situation with regard to clusters

The following is a fuller clarification of the situation with regard to clusters and groups. The National Council decided that it was too much to expect people to pay twice, i.e., as individual members, and then when joining a cluster. The Council made the decision which was reported and confirmed at the ACC conference and AGM in November 2007.

A cluster is now a group of people within a regional area who join the ACC as full members (concession or general). The new basis enables all the members to receive information at the same time via e-mail and/or post. A cluster appoints a contact person as a reference for the group for decisions and/or appointments to the AGM.

1.4 ACC Groups

An ACC group is similar to an ACC congregation, and is a group of members from the one congregation. In this situation, the congregation has been unable to agree at the time to become a congregational member, but has allowed an official group to be formed. The membership of the group is calculated on the same basis as a congregation: \$10 per member. Individual members do not receive direct mailings, but copies of material are sent to a contact person who distributes material and advises of ACC business and matters.
