1. Marriage Statement from the ACC

As members will know, with the critical debate continuing in the wider community and within the church, the ACC has been promoting and affirming the traditional Christian understanding of marriage. The National Council has now approved a statement on marriage. This was prepared by the ACC Task Group on Christian Marriage and Family and will be produced as a pamphlet for wider distribution among members and the Australian church. 2. *Christ's Living Gospel, Today* – Living in, and fulfilling, God's local mission – A Seminar

On the 24th and 25th of June at Port Augusta UC, there will be a combined HopeNet and ACC seminar. This seminar will seek to further equip participants for mission in their local areas. Firstly, mission is God's own mission to the world, which he is in fact already doing - as Lord, and by the power of the Holy Spirit. This means, in our own communities too! That is liberating truth and power that could set us free for a vision of mission in our lives and our communities that could radically transform both! 3. Easter News from Members

Witnessing in Newtown

In the week leading up to Easter, and over the Easter weekend, Newtown Mission placed a large wooden cross out the front of the mission during the day. Mock police tape cordoned off the area, and the words 'crime scene', were used to draw attention to the cross, along with the highlighted question *Why Did Jesus Die*?

Senior Pastor Doug Clements and other volunteers spent time out the front of the church, encouraging interaction and comment from people passing by. People were able to write their thoughts on a blackboard, or post-it notes. While a good number of people stopped to have an initial look, interestingly there was often little desire to talk about faith and life today, probably reflecting the secular and alternate nature of the area, but also the focus on having a fun and extended very long weekend.

A Visual Witness in Tasmania

ACC member Miriam Imms reports that in the Channel area (south of Hobart and opposite Bruny Island), the local churches arranged to keep their lights on during the Easter week from approximately 6pm to 10.30 pm in a chain of churches - Snug, Kettering, Woodbridge Anglican and Woodbridge Uniting - as a witness of light in a holiday atmosphere. The Anglicans placed 3 rough bush crosses on the roadside in front of the Woodbridge church, and on Good Friday draped them with a black cloth, and then on Sunday placed joyous colours which fluttered lively in the breeze. They were left for some time as a further visual witness.
