Greens benefit from 'ignorance vote'

The Australian Greens are benefitting from widespread ignorance of their policies, political journalist, Angela Shanahan, told a national conference in Camden this week. "There's a great deal of ignorance about what the Greens actually believe – and they are benefitting from this," Mrs Shanahan said. "They have benefitted from this in the recent national election." Shanahan was speaking at the national conference of the Assembly of Confessing Congregations, held at Camden Uniting Church [September 2-4]. Shanahan is a regular columnist in The Australian, The Canberra Times, The Age, Sydney Morning Herald, Spectator and Quadrant. She is also a member of the Catholic Church.

"If you want to see what an Australian Government led by the Greens will look like, just take a look at the Greens in Germany – because Bob Brown is a disciple of Petra Karin Kelly [a founder of the German Greens]. Have a look too at a book called 'The Greens' and co-written by Peter Singer and Bob Brown. Some of their policies are downright inhuman. "It's a deliberate attempt to undermine Australia's social cohesion. And only the churches have the gravitas and authority to fight this," she said. Shanahan said the Australian Greens had no category of family policy at all. "To the Greens, people are no more important than a Tasmanian green frog. Humanity has no inherent value – it has to fight against other species for a place in the world." She said the Greens had managed to gain support with some religious groups. "Despite the obvious incompatibility of the Greens with the Christian faith, they have successfully attracted some Christians. Their policy on religion sounds very tolerant – but it actually restricts faith."

Men, abortion is your issue too

Men – abortion is your issue too. That's the message from Joanne Lucas, a key speaker at a national conference in Camden this week.

"Women have been lied to" and "men have been trained to avoid the issue", she said. Speaking at the national conference of the Assembly of Confessing Congregations (ACC), held at Camden Uniting Church [September 2-4], Lucas demanded "a new type of feminism". The ACC is a vital network of evangelical/reformed churches within the Uniting Church in Australia (UCA). "We need a new kind of feminism – one that is powerful and honourable," Lucas said. "Women have been lied to. And in accepting that lie we have be *used* – used for a Culture of Death instead of a Culture of Life. Men have been trained to believe that abortion is *solely* a woman's issue. Don't perpetuate the lie that unless you have a womb you have nothing to say about abortion. "Women have a unique ability to impact human history – precisely because we give birth to it." Lucas said. "That is the unique genius of women." "It's a lie to say that children and men are by nature opposed to women and their needs and goals and ambitions. We need to help men to be great men, and to accept help from men."

Lucas said that only a quarter of all women today were willing to accept the "feminist" label. She said that while she appreciated what early feminism had achieved, "it no longer represents me, or many other women." Feminism has fragmented into a myriad of ideas, she said.

"Sexual reproductive rights are the main battleground now. But being equal must not be confused with being identical. Radical feminism idealizes androgeny [sexual ambiguity]. From this standpoint, children are seen as the 'ultimate barrier'. Increasingly, abortion has emerged as the litmus test of true feminism.

"It's wrong to say all forms of feminism are wrong. Women reconcile people – all people – with life. And this means women are uniquely aware of 'the other' – not only children, but all human beings."

Joanne Lucas has a Bachelors Degree in Psychology from the University of South Australia, and a Masters Degree in Theology from the JPII Institute for Life, Marriage & Family. In 2004 Joanne worked as a Research Officer at the Southern Cross Bioethics Institute, before going to Sydney to take up a position as the Catechumenate Coordinator, which she held until 2007. Since then she has been the Education Officer for the Life, Marriage & Family Centre for the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney.

4. DVD on Evangelism

The Discipleship and Evangelism Commission has produced a DVD study series called, "Conversations in Discipleship and Evangelism". This consists of 5 x ten minute DVD 'conversations' with study questions which can be used after. A copy of this DVD and study questions is being provided to each congregation in the ACC, with many congregations receiving their copy at the 2010 Conference. More DVDs will be produced and will be on for sale for \$10. A flyer will alert member. It is hoped that these sales will cover most of the production costs of the series. This DVD discusses 5 areas of discipleship and evangelism: 1) Disciples are called; 2) Disciples are Sent; 3) Disciples participate in Christ's ministry; 4) Disciples and discipline; 5) Disciples of the Gospel. These studies are ideal for use in a Bible Study, or to be handed around to congregation members. Both the studies and DVD's may be copied provided it is not for profit.
